Highways England are 'identifying options' for a new Arundel Bypass, aiming to choose them by November 2016, for public consultation in spring 2017. **One option cuts through Binsted village, and through the fields where the Strawberry Fair is held.**

What damage would the Binsted option cause?

- It would devastate Binsted's village, businesses & landscape.
- It would destroy its peaceful beauty, enjoyed by many visitors for walking, cycling and riding.
- It would fragment the best parts of the woods, which are all in the National Park.

What has ABNC found out?

In their 'A27 Feasibility Study' in 2015, Highways England tried to keep the route of the Binsted option secret by only publishing an unclear description. But an ABNC Freedom of Information request has revealed an earlier map of the Binsted route, matching their description:



This route is just as damaging to the Arundel watermeadows as the previously Preferred Route (Pink/Blue Route) and it is much more damaging to the rural communities and diverse countryside southwest of Arundel.

We aim to save Binsted AND solve traffic tailbacks on the A27 at Arundel.

What can we all do?
